CSH-7 Gangwon-do Seoraksan National Park and Sinheungsa Tour (Regional Tour / 1 Day)

Tour Schedule

Take a bus from Hotel and transfer to Gangwon-do. Seoraksan is famous as the most beautiful and representative mountaineering site in Korea. Seoraksan National Park has a variety of hiking trails, and you can enjoy especially beautiful scenery during the hiking seasons of spring and autumn. Take a cable car and experience climbing the top of Seoraksan Mountain's Gwongeumseong Fortress. From the observatory at the top of the mountain, you can see the beautiful Seoraksan Mountain and the surrounding area at a glance.

After lunch, visit Jogyesa Temple. This temple was founded in 652 (the 6th year of Queen Jindeok) by Jajangyulsa, and when it was destroyed by fire again in 1642, the temple was rebuilt in 1644 and called "Shinheungsa". At the end of the tour, we will take you to your hotel.

Seoraksan is a famous natural attraction that spans Goseong, Inje, and Yangyang-gun, including Sokcho-si, Gangwon-do. It was the fifth national park named after Hallyeohaesang National Park in 1970, and in 1982, it was designated as a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve for the first time in Korea. It is also listed on the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Green List, an internationally well-managed list of protected areas. Seoraksan National Park is divided into Oeseorak, Inner Seorak, and Namseorak, based on Daecheongbong, the main peak. Daecheongbong, the second highest mountain after Hallasan and Jirisan, is covered in snow for 5 to 6 months out of the year, and the name 'Seorak' is derived from this.

If you climb Daecheongbong Peak, you can see the beautiful natural scenery of Seoraksan Mountain and the East Sea, and the sunrise and sunset are particularly good. In addition, it is full of hidden unexplored places such as Biryong Falls, Ulsan Rock, Rock Rock, and Geumganggul Cave.

If you use the cable car operated in Seoraksan, the elderly or disabled can enjoy the scenery of Seoraksan without difficulty.
